Moses – Leader and Liberator

However you look at him, Moses is undoubtedly one of history's most significant figures. Christians, Jews and Muslims all honour him as a great spiritual leader. God used Moses to achieve a defining moment in the unfolding of his purposes for humanity. There is a pattern in the exodus of Israel out of Egypt and their security as God's people. This pattern is repeated throughout the Bible: God rescues a helpless people for their safety and his glory. The pattern reaches its culmination in the death and resurrection of Jesus to save us from our slavery to sin. As we study Exodus, we will see again and again how God saved us through Jesus – and what our response should be.

Living in Hope

Studies in 1 Thessalonians

The church in Thessalonica lived in constant expectation of the return of the Lord Jesus Christ. Even unbelievers remarked on the Thessalonian Christians firm and enthusiastic hope. Paul writes to encourage them in their faith and love, and to answer some questions they had about the Christian hope—the second coming of Jesus. Paul's affection for them is plain as he encourages them to keep on growing in the Christian life. May this part of God's Word help us to grow in faith, love and hope, as we eagerly wait for Jesus' return.

Before we start the series, we'll look at Paul's visit to Thessalonica recorded in Acts 17 and see what happened as Paul established this church.
