I hope this report will encourage you in what God is doing in the life of our church, as we pursue the mission of Jesus in the city of Blacktown. And may we give thanks to God in our prayers for the significant things he is doing among us, represented by the pages ahead.

Our Mission & Vision

In September 2019, we launched a Mission and Vision for our church. This was a way for us to place a marker on the map, and clearly define where we are going and what we are seeking to do. We defined it this way:

Our Mission is to grow people who Know Jesus, Treasure Jesus, Depend on Jesus and Represent Jesus.

This is our way of expressing what Jesus meant when he told us to make disciples in Matthew 28. This is the way we describe what it means to be a disciple of Jesus.

Our Vision, then, is an expression of what we believe could happen if we pursue that mission.

Our Vision is to see our city flourish in God's good design through a Jesus shaped community.

Under God, this is a picture of what success in our Mission will look like.

Importantly, our expression of our Mission and Vision isn't tied to one particular method. We pursue this Mission and Vision in our ever-changing context, navigating around opportunities that arise, as well as the challenges that confront us.

Our goal is always clear: Jesus. To grow in our depth and breadth, as individuals and as a community, in all that he has designed and called us—and all people—into.

On the following pages, you will see some of the ways our Mission and Vision has landed in practice and some of the plans we have for the future as we continue to pursue this together. In bringing all things together under our Mission and Vision, our hope is to be as effective as possible in faithfully serving God in this city with the resources God has provided us.



Rector's Reflections

Reflections on the past 12 months

The past 12 months have been deeply encouraging as I reflect on the ways our church community has grown in depth of maturity, in strengthening of Jesus shaped relationships among one another, and for those who have come to put their trust in Jesus for the first time.

After a few challenging years through covid, there is much to be thankful about what God is doing to renew and strengthen our church.

Pauls prayer in Philippians 1:9-11 has been a constant prayer for both myself, and for our church family:

⁹And this is my prayer: that your love may abound more and more in knowledge and depth of insight, ¹⁰so that you may be able to discern what is best and may be pure and blameless for the day of Christ, ¹¹filled with the fruit of righteousness that comes through Jesus Christ—to the glory and praise of God.

This annual report highlights many aspects of our church life and how we are continuing to develop and pursue our Mission and Vision in the life of our church. A few key items are worth bringing to your attention.

Sudanese Congregation

In 2022, Robbie and I have spent significant time with Sudanese leaders to think, plan and pray about the future of the congregation. I have spent considerable time working with the Sudanese congregation over the past few years, as together we have identified some areas of critical need to grow the congregation in its spiritual health and missional edge.

One of the common challenges that every cultural- or language-based congregation experiences in time is the shift from being a congregation of migrants toward an increasing number who have been born and raised in Australia. Typically, this can create significant divides between generations, and this is one of a number of challenges we are seeing in our Sudanese

congregation, and among Sudanese congregations in Australia more broadly.

After many years of faithful service, Eiliya resigned from his position in 2022. In my time working with him, I have seen Eiliya serve with great humility and patience, and I admire him greatly for those qualities. I am thankful to God for his service and commitment to the congregation. While Eiliya is stepping down from the role, he will remain a member of this church, and I am glad to see that continue.

Staff

I am incredibly thankful to God for our staff team. Robbie, Renee and Laurice each bring a unique set of gifts and skills to their roles, and it continues to give me great joy to partner alongside them. The blessings and benefits of serving together for several years now continues to strengthen of the team, and has felt very much like the sum of us is greater than the individual parts. I thank each of them for their valued leadership in our church, their servant-hearted nature, and their deep desire to see our church grow and flourish in our Mission and Vision.

It is wonderful to welcome Larissa and Lual onto our staff team for 2023. I have great anticipation that they will both be wonderful additions that support the growth of both our staff team and our church.

In response to our pledging in October, we have been able to appoint Larissa as our part-time Local Mission Pastor. Larissa brings a unique experience and perspective that will be an excellent addition to our team. She will be particular involved in helping us shape some of our existing ministries to be resourced and equipped to grow in capacity for serving both the practical and spiritual needs of our city. Larissa will also be helping us develop further our ministry to youth and young adults, including through the local university and our planning for an evening congregation.

Lual joins as our new Sudanese Pastor, and brings significant ministry experience in Sydney as an ordained minister. As mentioned earlier, there are some significant challenges in this space that should not be understated. But I am confident that under God, with Lual join our team, we are well placed to take some key steps in addressing the future health of the congregation.

Moore College Mission

Toward the end of March this year, we will be welcoming a team of students from Moore Theological College to join us for a week. We are partnering with the local Anglican churches (Doonside, Lalor Park, Seven Hills, Rooty Hill, Minchinbury, Mt Druitt and Oakhurst) as together we build connections with the major training college of the Diocese. The intention for this week is two-fold. Firstly, to encourage students to see the many gospel opportunities in western Sydney. Secondly, it is an opportunity for us to be encouraged as we meet and hear the stories of those training to serve in a variety of future ministry endeavours. I pray this week will inspire and encourage us in what God is doing both in our city and beyond.

Evening Service Planning Team

In October, we announced our desire to begin working towards planting an evening congregation. This year, we are gathering a team of people to think, plan and pray for the future possibility of starting a service in 2024.

A new congregation will open up a variety of opportunities for us in our church life.

- It will open up new avenues to connect people to church who are otherwise unable to connect to a morning service;
- It will allow people to increase their involvement in serving in Kids Church, while still attending a service of their own;
- It will provide an opportunity to grow and develop a new generation of leaders.

Planning to start a new congregation is no small task. There is much excitement and enthusiasm as we work on this. But none of our desires or plans will amount to anything without God's hand in it all.

Please be praying for God's wisdom and guidance over all these matters, as we strive to grow people who Know Jesus, Treasure Jesus, Depend on Jesus and Represent Jesus, for the glory of Jesus and for our joy.





Bible studies





Discover Jesus






We ran a series of Discover Jesus courses, of which 12 people attended, with 3 looking at Jesus seriously for the first time.


Earlier in the year, we welcomed another of our mission partners, Neville Naden (with BCA) who preached and shared an update on his work.

Sudanese Developments

In 2022, we worked through a process to identify some of the complexities of ministry in this space, and clarify the needs, desires and possibilities of the congregation going forward. As part of this process, Eiliya resigned from his position after many years of faithful service to the community.

Through this process, God has answered our prayers through Lual's appointment as we seek to grow the health and missional capacity of our Sudanese congregation.

What's Next?



Evening Congregation Planning

In 2023, we're gathering a team together to think plan and pray for the future possibility of launching an evening congregation. This will form part of our strategy in developing a long-term, healthy ministry to young adults both inside and outside our church community, as well as strengthening our present youth ministry with clear pathways as they grow up. The planning team will also provide a great opportunity to develop the next generation of leaders in the life of our church through both theological thinking and practical experience.

Bible Reading in heart languages

During our Revelation series, our 10am service will hear a member of our church read the Bible in their heart language each week. It is an opportunity to hear a variety of new voices from the front and to more visibly show that we welcome people into our church from all walks of life. It will also allow others of us to experience what it is like to attend a church in an unfamiliar language, and to provoke us to consider further how we reach the diversity of people in our city.

Leadership Training Events

In 2023, we are looking to continue to build on the foundations we have begun for leadership training across our whole church. As well as targeted training for particular ministry areas throughout the year, we are hosting two training events for all leaders across our church to attend. This will provide an opportunity for us to develop our broad leadership skills, and continue to grow our leadership capacity in pursuing our mission across all areas of the life of our church. We are also looking to bring clarity to leadership roles, responsibilities, and expectations across all ministries.

Building our Sudanese Ministry

Under the leadership of Lual, we are prayerfully seeking to implement a more unified structure of leadership in line with the wider parish, and a deeper engagement of partnership between congregations.

Depend on Jesus


By being prayerful, generous & courageous

Simply Start Praying



During Prayer Week, we launched a brand new resource to help equip and encourage people to grow in their prayer habits, especially if they don't know where to begin. Along with the resource, we encouraged people to utilise the digital app, Prayer Mate, as

a way of growing regular habits of prayer.

Prayer Week



We continued to set aside a week devoted to reflecting and growing in prayer together, with Peter Jensen joining us to preach on the Lord's prayer.

Prayer Gatherings

We held a couple of prayer gatherings through the year as a way of setting aside an extended time to pray for our city, our church and our mission.

Pledging

In 2022, we reintroduced pledging as a means of being wise and faithful stewards of the resources God provides us as a church. Together, our church responded with great generosity, leading us to pursuing the employment of a new staffing position to focus especially on local mission.

What's Next?



Increased prayer across our services

As we look to focus our sermon series each on one particular area of our mission, our 10am services will be structured in ways that help to highlight this focus across the whole gathering. In our service format that focusses on Depending on Jesus, we will be using a variety of methods for praying specifically for various aspects of church life and mission, with an increase in prayer as part of those services.

Seeking to expand our engagement with our city


Part of our desire for 2023 is to begin a variety of new initiatives as we step out in faith and deep dependence to reach new demographics within our city. In 2023, we are hoping to grow our connection with the local university, and pursue the ministry opportunities it provides. Our evening congregation plans are a step in faith and courage to see if we are able to start a significant new initiative to reach many, especially younger people, within our city.

Open Doors Sunday

Our English classes run on Tuesday evenings and Wednesday mornings, and help meet a significant practical need of people in and around our city.


Playtime



Our playtime ministry continues see a regular group of families attending both from those who have recently joined our church, and from those in the wider community.


Represent Jesus

Scripture in Schools

We also partner with COBIS (Churches of Blacktown in Schools) who are involved in supporting Scripture teachers and other workers in several local high schools.

Domestic Abuse Seminar



Blacktown Hospital

Luke & Robbie are connected with the pastoral care team in the hospital, and are on call to visit people who would like to speak to an Anglican minister. Typically these are people in critical situations, and our presence is greatly appreciated by patients and their families, and hospital staff view us as an important part of broader patient health and care.


Mission Partners

We continue to support them through the difficulties of the pandemic. Our Beyond Blacktown mission committee continue to work faithfully in connecting with, praying, and supporting their work on behalf of our church.

In 2023, we are hoping to build connections and identify some of the key ministry opportunities that arise with the Australian Catholic University campus in Blacktown.



Visitation Team




Regular giving trend

Key changes in revenue in 2022: (increase of \$37,834 compared to 2021)

- A decrease of \$30,000 in one-off funding, Community Building grant in 2021 not repeated in 2022;
- A decrease of approximately \$6,500 in rents, rent from the counselling service ceased part way through 2021;
- An increase of approximately \$42,000 in regular and other giving in the parish, approx. 50% of this from large one-off donations;
- Approximately \$20,000 surplus from PACS (counselling service) donated to the church on the winding up of that service;
- Approximately \$8,500 in receipts and donations for events, which is offset by expenditure on those events; and

- Approximately \$3,000 recovered by the Church Property Trust related to historical property expenses and deposits.

Key changes in expenses in 2022: (decrease of \$9,193 compared to 2021.)

- A decrease in property project costs of \$30,000 funded in 2021 by the Community Building grant;
- Lower ministry staff costs of approximately \$11,000, largely related to accrual for untaken leave in 2021 not repeated in 2022 as leave was taken;
- An increase of approximately \$17,000 in property maintenance costs compared to the previous year. 2021 costs were lower than average and there were significant repair costs this year related to roof leaks;
- Approximately \$10,400 in parish event costs, largely offset by income and donations; and
- Small increases in ministry expenses and Diocesan charges.

Key variances from Budget in 2022: (net result \$64,272 better than expected)

- Parish giving approximately \$38,000 better than expected;
- Donation from PACS of approximately \$20,000;
- Unexpected income from the Church Property trust of approximately \$3,000;
- Staff costs lower than expected by approx. \$11,000 due to leave accrual adjustment;
- Lower than budget office admin costs, approximately \$4,000; and
- Offset by higher than budget property costs of approximately \$10,000.

Mission Support

The Prescribed Financial Statements only reflect mission support out of general parish funds, money donated in the parish specifically for mission work is not shown.

In 2022 mission support payments of \$22,766 were made (\$18,616 in the previous year), with payments to CMS, Pioneers, MAF, BCA and Scripture Union in accordance with our planned support and donor-specified amounts to Compassion and Perry & Kim Anderson.

2023 Budget

The Parish Council proposed a draft budget for 2023 that included an increase in staff expenses. This was communicated to the parish during October 2022 when the congregations were asked to consider their giving and indicate by pledge their proposed level of giving.

Although the proposed 2023 budget required a substantial increase in giving from the 2022 budget, approximately 16%, this was supported by the pledge and Parish Council committed to the budget for 2023 on that basis, and Luke commenced the hiring process.

Although there is an increase in regular giving pledged in 2023, overall revenue is budgeted to decrease in 2023, with significant one-offs in 2022, particularly the PACS donation, not expected to be repeated.

Staff costs will increase due to additional staff and increased rates to offset some of the increased cost of living. There is not any substantial shift in other expenditure, other than an inflation impact.

Property maintenance costs remain the most significant variable expense in the budget. In 2023 the budget is based on an average level of maintenance and no large capital maintenance costs. The parish has a small fund (\$50,000) set aside that can be accessed should significant capital maintenance be required.

The budget for 2023 runs at a small deficit that is effectively funded from the unplanned one-off income items from 2022 and is not a risk to the parish financial position.

The funding of ministry in this parish is substantially from the faithful giving of the members of the parish, and it is encouraging to see this growing and enabling the new opportunities in the parish.

Warden's Report

This is a brief account of the main property issues dealt with by the wardens this year. It is included in the AGM papers to keep church members informed of some of the issues that are going on in the background.

Noteworthy issues dealt with this year are listed below in no particular order:

1. Roof leaks continue to be a recurring issue. Remedial action taken includes:
 - a. The valley above the cot room in the CCC had a couple of major leaks which caused damage to the cot room ceiling. After a number attempts by one roofing contractor to prevent the leaks it was decided we would engage a different contractor to seal the valley with a moulded polymer sheet. This has resulted in a marked improvement with a slight leak being detected since this was done.
 - b. The cot room ceiling was replaced with a suspended ceiling which allows for easy replacement of ceiling tiles when damaged.
 - c. A leak in the Creche was repaired.
2. Glass replacement. One of the glass doors at the car park entrance was replaced after an errant dog smashed it. (Yes, fact is stranger than fiction). One large window pane was replaced after it developed a crack that appears to have been caused building movement.
3. The landscaping and signage on the Richmond Rd frontage is complete. The signage, which was completed this week, includes a new car park entrance sign.
4. Over the course of the last couple of years we have had an issue with youths gathering in the small park at the rear of our car park. These gatherings often spill into the car park. Behaviour by this group includes alcohol abuse, noise and broken bottles. The police have been called a number of times. In a recent event a number of the car park bollards were damaged. Negotiations are ongoing with the council to have the park declared an alcohol free zone. We have also applied for a grant through the CCTV Program of the Department of Community and Justice with the goal of installing CCTV in the car park. These issues are ongoing.

5. During the course of the year the equipment that allows live streaming of services has been upgraded. This includes cameras, microphone, etc.

As always the wardens would like to thank all the volunteers that perform a myriad of tasks for us.

Without your help and cooperation this place would not function. We won't mention any names but you know who you are – thank you so much!

Our 2040 Vision

Over the coming years, Blacktown will see many more people come and call this city 'home'. We seek to grow, spiritually and numerically, so that we might pursue our Vision to see our city flourish, in God's good design, through the Jesus shaped community we are within this city. We are dreaming big about the kind of impact we might have, and how we might see this Vision become a reality. Here are some of our big dreams for our church, ministry and mission as we look toward 2040:

- 100 new confessions of faith in Jesus each year.
- 1000 kids in a holiday kids club program.
- A growing community of trained leaders equipped and empowered to serve Jesus in our church, our city and around the world.
- Resourcing the global church to pursue excellence in cross-cultural and cross-generational ministry.
- Having a clear Jesus shaped identity and character that is known, recognised and appreciated throughout our city, its people and institutions.
- A thriving ministry involvement in the new Blacktown university.
- A network of church congregations gathering each week across our city, and a recognised partnership with other Christian churches for the sake of the gospel.
- Our church representing the diversity of the city in age, culture & language.
- A significant and visible presence with staff and patients in the hospital, where our partnership in public health is recognised and valued.
